Give Next Kickoff Day

Kickoff Day is the official start of the Give Next program year for stu¬dents. It is a one day mini-conference for Larimer County middle and high school students participating in Give Next.

Highlights from the day include:

Youth speaker Litzy Lastra, a 2019 Poudre High School graduate and current Colorado State University student and our Keynote speaker Tariana Navas-Nieves, Director of Cultural Affairs for the City and County of Denver. Both spoke to students about the importance of inclusion and diverse representation in grantmaking, and in efforts to make positive community change.

Career panelists Wendell Stainsby and Hailey Summers, from CSU Energy Institute, and Dr. Scott Shrake, from CSU's Institute for Entrepreneurship, shared stories of when they first found their passion and reassured students that it's okay to try many different things, fail sometimes, and follow their own path to an impactful career.

Emcee Brandon Harrington, from Harrington Arts Alliance, kept students energized and focused throughout the day, end-ing with a customized Give Next song and a dance party.





Youth Inspiration

At the end of Kickoff Day we asked students to share the most inspiring thing they learned. Common themes included an increased awareness of the many nonprofits doing great work in our community and a sense of excitement that even as students, they can make an impact.
